

Dwayne Dopsie and The Hellraisers are available for a variety of promotional and educational programs.

<u>Workshops</u> — As the son of 'King of Zydeco' Rockin' Dopsie, Dwayne is a walking history of Zydeco music. He is deeply committed to furthering the genre, especially in light of the fact that the Grammy Awards recognize Zydeco in the Cajun/Zydeco category. Dwayne honors the history of the music and stands with one foot firmly planted in tradition and the other in innovation. The typical workshop will speak in depth about the tradition and its history in a down home 'talk story' format that is relaxing and will keep the audience entranced. (Up to one hour)

<u>Lecture/Demonstrations</u> — Dwayne's program format of preference. A balanced hour of 'talk story' style history spiced with fiery examples of some of the varying Zydeco styles and how the different musical instruments of this music art interact with each other. (Up to one hour)
