## **Starting your introduction**

### **Save it for later**

It is totally fair to assume that you have to write the introductory chapter that has to be written before the other chapters of your research paper because it comes first and the reader would read it first. However, you should know that it does not have to be the first thing that you write. You may create a rough draft of your introduction but you should always write it after completing the rest of your research paper. After finishing your research paper, you will have a better understanding of the topic and therefore, would be better able to compose a better introductory chapter.

### **Start off by introducing the topic**

You should begin your introduction by enlightening the readers about the broad subject and topic of your research paper. You have to provide all the necessary information that is necessary information that you may think is crucial for the readers to understand the topic. The first few sentences should give a broad view of the topic and then you should gradually narrow it down to the specific research problem. You have to spark the interest of the readers in this section.

### **Refer to the keywords**

If you are writing the research paper for publication, you will be given a list of keywords that you have to include in your introduction. These keywords will indicate the area of your research to the reader. In addition to these keywords, you also have to emphasize some words that appear in the title of your research paper.

### **Narrow down the research**

After giving a broad view of the topic of your research, you have to come to smoothly narrow down the focus of your research. You have to clarify to the readers which aspects or elements of the research problem you will be addressing in your research paper. You can do that by setting a limit to the geographical area, demographic boundaries, and time period of the research that you will be covering in your research paper.

### **Briefly summarizing the literature review**

You can also briefly discuss the literature review of the existing literature on the topic of your research. This is very important to show it to the readers that you have complete knowledge of the subject matter under discussion and you are only focusing on those issues that you think had not been addressed by previous researchers.

### **Showing the relevance of your research**

To get the readers to keep reading your research paper, you have to tell them why it is important and relevant for them to read it. You have to explain the underlying rationale of your research. You should explain what problem or lacunas in the available research you are going to address in your research paper "[essay writer](#)". You should tell it to the readers if you are going to give a solution to a widespread problem in your research paper. You should explain what contributions you are making in the field of your subject.

### **State your research questions**

At the end of your introductory chapter, you will discuss the research question that you will be discussing in your research paper. You should make sure that your research questions are especially focused. These questions should not be appearing out of anywhere but instead, be arising from your previous discussion in the introduction.

**State the hypothesis**

After stating the research questions, you should present some potential answers to your research questions, hypothesis. This would act as the thesis statement of your research paper. You will be discussing and testing the hypothesis in the body of your research paper.

**Give an overview of the research paper**

In the end, you can end the introductory chapter of your research paper by giving an overview of the entire body of your research paper. Depending on the length of your paper, you can either give that overview in either one paragraph or you can summarize each chapter in a separate paragraph.
